Calling For Educational and Pastoral Programs on Addiction

New Slavery, New Freedom — A Pastoral Message on Substance Abuse 1990, United States Catholic Conference, Washington, DC

"Our church response to drug and alcohol dependency must draw upon all of our spiritual, pastoral, social, and institutional resources.... Every parish should be reminded that chemical dependency tears at the fabric not just of family and community but of our faith community as well.

Whenever some are tormented by chemical dependency, we all suffer. AFIRE PROVIDES THESE RESOURCES

An Alcohol and Drug Awareness effort should develop educational, informational, preventive, and advocacy programs of service to the entire community. Whenever possible, our parishes should offer adult education programs on a regular basis to make this knowledge available to as many families as possible. AFIRE HAS SUCH A PROGRAM FOR PARISHES

Parish schools and religious education programs should include an appropriate substance-abuse curriculum, with maximum appropriate parental involvement and collaboration with other schools and community educational efforts. Teachers and other professionals should be trained to present this curriculum." AFIRE PROVIDES A COMPREHENSIVE EDUCATIONAL VIDEO SERIES

Out of her pastoral concern for individuals, families, and the entire society, the Church is involved in the prevention of drugs and addiction. She desires to continue this work together with people of good will, in the light of her global vision of [human life]. She wants to develop scholastic, health care structures, and institutions that are open to all, as well as to create within parish circles meeting places, educational clubs and centers of prevention, which will enable her to fulfill her mission to the community.

AFIRE HAS CURRENT PROGRAMS & PLANS FOR AN EVIDENCE-BASED RECOVERY PROGRAM

The Church is called to work with all people of good will against the discrimination of [those suffering from drug addiction]; their social exclusion into poor and degraded quarters, and the fear of meeting with and helping [those who are addicted].

AFIRE ADDRESSES THE STIGMA, PROMOTES HUMAN DIGNITY, AND ENCOURAGES EMPATHY

"[Strategies should be devised] for the entire parish community so that there may be more concern and activity in this field."
